

Disclosure Statement for Ruben Enikolopov for the paper “Can Development Programs Counter Insurgencies? Evidence from a Field Experiment in Afghanistan”

The collection and processing of household survey data analyzed by the article was financed by the Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development of the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, which implemented the National Solidarity Program.

Funding for the design and supervision of household survey data collection was provided by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO).
