Paper Title: Missing Women, Integration Costs, and Big Push Policies in the Saudi Labor Market

This project was started while Peck was a Postdoctoral Research Associate at the Center for Complex Engineering Systems, a collaboration between MIT and the King Abdulaziz City for Science and Technology in Saudi Arabia. The research for this paper was supported by a joint grant from the Human Resources Development Fund (HRDF) of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, the Ministry of Labor and Social Development of Saudi Arabia (MLSD) and Evidence for Policy Design (EPoD) at the Harvard Kennedy School. The Ministry also provided administrative data to support this research. In sharing the data, the Ministry asked that MLSD officials have the opportunity to review the manuscript prior to publication to ensure that confidentiality of individually identifiable firm information was preserved. No changes were made to the manuscript in response to this review.
