

# Pink Papers at the Annual Meeting

CSQIEP commissions two "Pink Papers" sessions every year at the AEA annual meeting: one featuring economics research on LGBTQ+ populations and one featuring LGBTQ+ identified economists presenting their new research (fields rotate each year).



## **Mentoring Program**

CSQIEP matches LGBTQ+ identified economics PhD students and early career PhD economists (e.g., Assistant Professors) with senior LGBTQ+ identified economists for virtual mentoring throughout the year on topics such as navigating issues of identity and coming out in one's graduate program/ workplace, publishing LGBTQ+-related economics research, work/life balance, and related issues. New mentees and mentors are accepted on a rolling basis.
